- **10:00-10:07am (Introductions & Ice Breaker)**
 - a. Members of the meeting introduced themselves and the agency they are representing.
- **10:10-10:30am (TCCAP Presentation)**
 - a. Lauren talked about the community health assessment that is being put on. This assessment consists of identifying the strengths within our community. After the data is formulated they will then come up with a game plan on how to best help the community.
 - i. The benefits of this community assessment is to identify priority needs and to better utilize the resources that are readily available to the community. This is a great way to link resources to the community.
 - ii. Recruitment of stakeholders is something that is happening right now to start the kick off meeting and get as many people involved as possible. In August the local health status assessment is something that will be taking place as well as different focus groups that will be going on.
 - iii. In September there will be asset mapping to see what kind of resources are available, this will help in the planning process.
 - iv. If you have any questions about this you can reach out to Stephanie Rosas or Lauren Wong.
- **10:30-10:45am (PneumaCare Health and Wellness Presentation)**
 - a. Pastor Jason Talks about the food distribution that they do through their ministry (they help anyone regardless of Religious belief).
 - i. Pnuemacare is a staff of 12 and they have caseloads ranging from homelessness and people who suffer from severe mental illness and help them get access to care.
 - ii. Get the people who use the ER as their primary care provider a doctor.
 - iii. Housing program has 190 enrollments. People who need housing... getting individuals ready for housing. They help people by aiding them in the application process.

- iv. Pastor Jason says that they stay with families for up to 12 months to make sure that they are stable and help out with things like bills and other necessities.
 - v. They provide first month of rent and PG and E.
 - vi. Once you are approved for medical they help you use it they best of their ability. They also provide rides if needed to make sure that they make it to their appointments.
 - vii. The care plan is created to make sure that they get all the referrals that they need.
 - viii. The way to qualify for housing is have some sort of condition and has no housing. Children who are at risk for lack of housing are automatically qualified for housing.
 - ix. There will be a program at the hospital that will be created to target the priority populations talked about during this presentation.
 - x. Farm Fresh Fund- If they spend 20 on their CalFresh card they get \$25 on top of the \$10 that was already provided for produce.
 - xi. The flyer will be included in the partners for health email along with other resources.
- **10:45-11:15am (Focus Group/Group Discussion)**
 - a. **Tobacco** – American Lung Association went to I and E days and got to participate in the meeting with legislature Gallagher (Staff member). CCOE is applying for new grant, the grant applies to the entire county. SWAT (students working against tobacco). TCAAP is doing training in the community, this group is kind of similar to what pastor Jason. There are a lot of new people that are moving into the migrant camp.
 - b. **Community Strengthening-** The Community strengthening breakout room talked about the oral health program and what the oral health program does. Amilcar and Elvert asked if Oral Health can take bags of hygiene material to the safe haven location for homeless and ex-cons. Marissa Apeso from one stop said that they give out food for the homeless on Tuesdays and asked if Oral health can bring bags with oral health hygiene materials to give to the homeless. Jennifer Diaz said that people with ebt cards can shop at the farmers market and get fresh produce. The farmer’s market will open on the first Thursday of June. Marissa gets food from sav mor to give out to the homeless.
 - i. Oral Health and Nutrition subcommittees did not meet
